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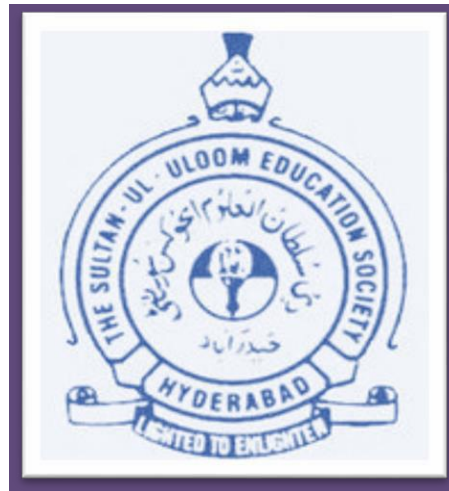

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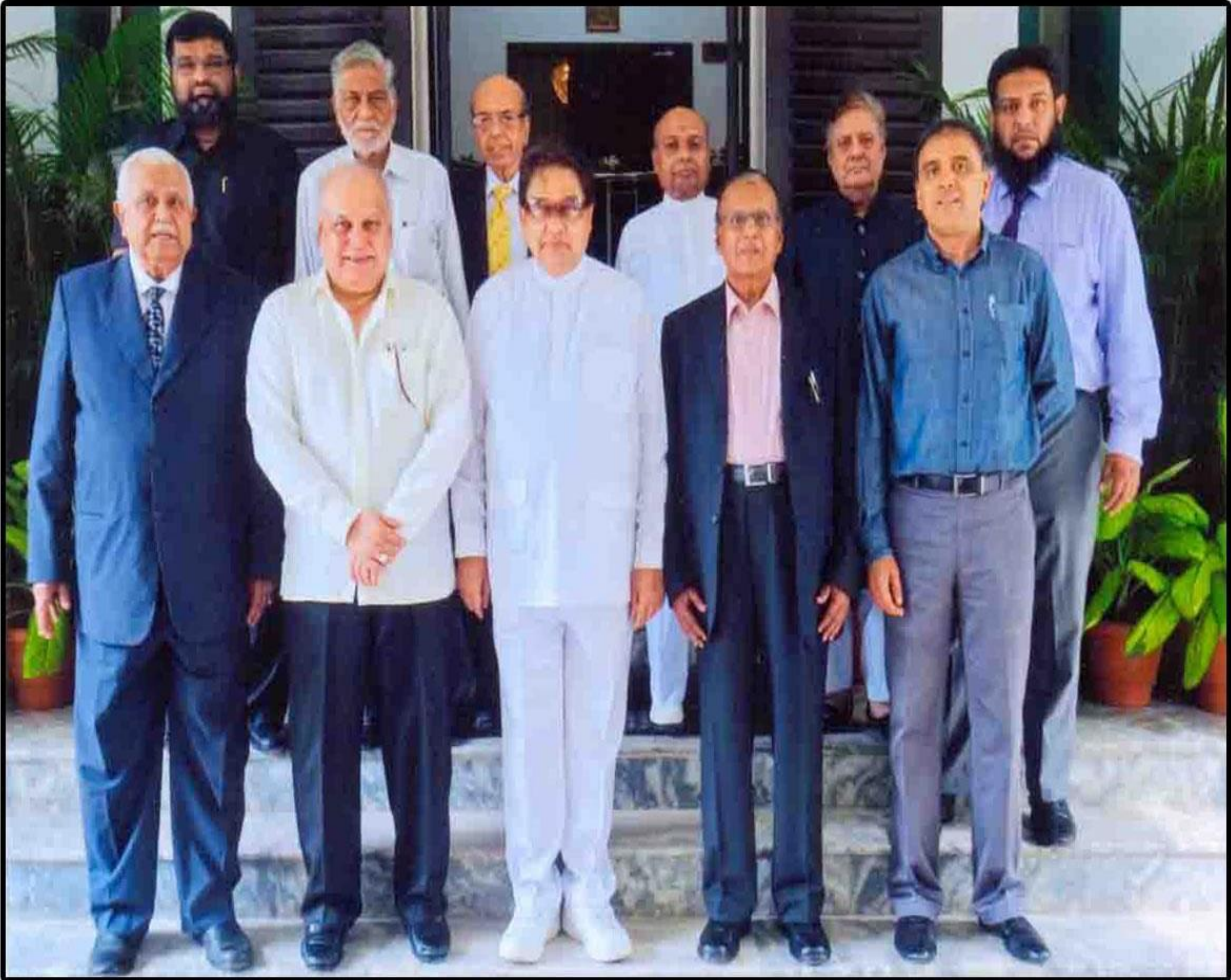
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EDITORIAL

ANNUAL REPORT 2016-17

“Genius is one percent INSPIRATION and ninety nine percent PERSPIRATION.” --Thomas Alva Edison. Edison’s timeless observation applies in describing some of the awe-inspiring innovations and collaborative efforts in education reform, impactful research and educator preparation that is witnessed at Ghulam Ahmed College of Education every year. You cannot teach inspiration, but you can teach inspired and you can teach inspirationally. This is what happens daily at the college, and it’s an infectious feel-good phenomenon. We believe in making every student toil, to discover the treasure he/she has within...and turn him or her into a genius.

Ghulam Ahmed College of Education, though almost 32 years old, believes in transforming Education and strengthening Society with the changing times. The curriculum in the college was revised for both B.Ed and M.Ed. courses from the academic year 2015-17. Both the courses are now of 2 years’ duration.

The classes for the M.Ed. course, 2016-18 batch began with all vibrancy in August, 2016. The B.Ed. course started in September, 2016. This year we have a total of 74 students in the B.Ed. course and 18 students in the M.Ed. course. Moreover, we have a committed group of teaching and non teaching staff members, who are the driving force and spirit behind the institution. Our Faculty members are experienced practitioners who help the students in learning relevant skills and information.

Library facilities: Our library provides an extensive range of learning materials to the students. It has internet facility and a number of educational CDs. The students are encouraged to extensively use the library for reference work in their theory subjects, research work, assignments, etc. There are a total of 10249 books in the library, 25 journals and 10 magazines are also subscribed. 105 books were added to the library this year.

Internship Programme: After a thorough practice of teaching skills at the college, the students were sent for their teaching practice programme and internship to different schools of twin cities, for a period of 4 months spread over 3 semesters.

Project work: Six special projects were taken up in the B.Ed., course – Self Development (Yoga, Communicative English and life Skills) Project, ICT Project, Community Studies Project and School Study, Action research Project, Reflective Reading and Drama and Arts Project. The students either did the project work individually or in a group. Different topics were assigned to different students to avoid repetition and copying. The students also took up a special project on “Environment and its Care”. Practical classes were conducted for the B.Ed students in the Language Laboratory.

Integration of technology in teaching: Several multimedia presentations were prepared by the B.Ed. students with the help of PowerPoint, on computers. The projects prepared were on different subjects like Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, English Language, Social Studies and Biological Sciences.

The M.Ed students also took up classes for the B.Ed students using technology (Power Point Presentations). They also prepared brochures and newsletters.

Research work: The students of M.Ed. course take up in-depth research work every year and submit a monograph report. Efforts are being made to collaborate the research work with the SCERT, Telangana. Research Proposals on two broad areas have been submitted to the Director, SCERT in February, 2016.

Mentorship: An effective strategy used to train student teachers is assigning a formal mentor to work one-on-one with them. The lecturers of the college are entrusted the responsibility of mentorship. They monitor the progress of the students regularly and help in resolving their problems, if any.

Literary activities like elocution, debate, extempore talk and recitation competitions were organized. B.Ed. students participated in the inter college Quiz competition organized by the Hyderabad Literary Society in December last year.

Games and Sports: Several games and sports were organized for the college students.

Celebration of Important Days: National Festivals like Independence Day and Republic Day were celebrated. Teacher's day, Children's day, National Integration day and Army day were also celebrated last year.

Extension lectures/seminars/workshops organized:

The following extension lectures and seminars were organized in the college to enable the students and teachers to keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in the field of education.

- A State Level Seminar on the theme, 'Exploring the mystical world of Research' was organized in the college from 22nd to 24th April, 2016. Students of different Colleges of Education of the State attended the Seminar. Prof.Suresh Babu from SCERT inaugurated the Seminar and Prof.Mrinalini, Dean, Dept of Education, Osmania University was invited for the Valedictory function. Mr.Zafar Javeed, Hon.Secretary, Mr.S.A.Wahab, Chairman of the college, Dr.Mir Akbar Ali Khan, Treasurer also attended the valedictory function. Several eminent educationists were invited as speakers, like Prof.V.Sudhakar, Dr.Yakaiah, Dr.Sunitha, etc.
- A demonstration cum lecture by Mrs.Lubna on the topic, 'Use of Crafts in Classrooms' was organized on 24-10-2016.
- An extension lecture by Mrs. Rubina Hussaini on the topic, 'Fostering Concept formation in Children through Drama' was organized on 26-10-2016.
- A Work shop on "Demonstration of Art & Craft items and preparation of Teaching Aids" was conducted for students of the B.Ed., course in December, 2016.
- A work shop on 'Yoga and its benefits' was organized for college students in December last year.

The Students Council: The student's council is a body of elected members that incorporates a sense of leadership and democracy among the students. An election for Class representatives was held for both the sections of the B.Ed. course.

Internal examinations were conducted regularly for the students of B.Ed. and M.Ed courses.

Results: The overall performance of the college students was good. In the academic year 2015-17, the pass percentage in the **M.Ed.** course was 100% with 16 students getting A grade(distinction), 13 students getting B grade(I Division), 04 students getting C grade (II division)and 1 student getting D Grade. **Ms. Qamar Sultana** secured the 1st rank in Osmania University in the **M.Ed.** course, 2014-15 batch. The pass percentage in the **B.Ed.** course was 91% with 15 distinctions, 71 first classes, 68 second classes and 16 pass divisions.

A FEW OTHER HAPPENINGS...

- A two-day orientation programme for the newly appointed lecturers of the SES campus was organized on the theme “Art and Aesthetics of teaching” on 21-12-2016 and 22-12-2016. Around 60 lecturers from different colleges of the campus attended the two-day program. Eminent educationists were invited as the resource persons and the Hon. Secretary, SES, Mr.Zafar Javeed graced the Valedictory function.
- The Personality Development Programme was started by the Amjad Ali Khan College of Business Administration, for the B.Ed. students of the college last year.
- A field trip to Shilparamam was organized for the B.Ed. students of the college in October last year to expose the students to local crafts.
- A picnic to Escape Adventure Park was organized for college students in November last year.
- Students participated whole heartedly in the Haritha Haram program in July/August last year.

Programmes for in-service teachers:

The college caters to the needs of not only pre service teachers but also in-service teachers.

- An Orientation programme for Class X teachers of Sultan-Ul-Uloom group of schools was organized in November last year, by the Academic Committee, SES.
- The members of the Academic Committee visited the Sultan-Ul-Uloom group of schools in February, 2017 to talk to the teachers and students of Classes IX and X.
- Several meetings of the Principals of the old city schools with members of the Academic Committee were convened last year to discuss the progress and academic activities of the schools.

Community Service was taken up by the M.Ed and B.Ed., students. They adopted several slum areas around Hyderabad City and organized programmes for the welfare of community people.

Faculty accomplishments: A number of new faculty members were appointed in the college to meet the new norms of the NCTE.

- The faculty members of the college are constantly upgrading their qualifications and in the process winning laurels for themselves and the college.
- Several Articles were published by lecturers of the college in educational journals at State and national level.
- Books and Teaching material were authored by lecturers in English and Telugu languages.
- Almost all the lecturers acted as resource persons and presented papers at various workshops and Seminars at National and State level, conducted by the Osmania University and its constituent institutions.
- The Principal and lecturers attended orientation programmes, seminars and workshops in Education.

Student's accomplishments: Our college students won inter college literary competitions organized by the Sultan Ul Uloom College of Pharmacy, last year. Many of our college students were selected as teachers in top schools like Glendale Academy, CHIREC, Jubilee Hills Public School, VIP International School and Government Schools etc.

Inspections held: A team from the Osmania University came for Annual inspection in June last year. An inspection was successfully done by the Vigilance team, Government of Telangana, on 16th and 17th August, 2016.

CONCLUSION: Our earnest thanks to the Chairman, Vice Chairman, Hon.Secretary, Joint Secretary, Treasurer and other honorable members of the Board of Governors, Sultan-ul-Uloom Education Society for their constant assistance and support in the smooth functioning of the college.

WHY IS ART INTEGRATION NECESSARY IN EDUCATION?

The following words of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore are possibly the best answer to this question. In Gitabitan, he says, when I see the universe through my songs, I recognize it, then only I know it.....".

Firstly, when Art is integrated with education, it helps the child apply art -based enquiry, investigation and Exploration, critical thinking and creativity for a deeper understanding of the concept's hot topics.

Secondly, Art Integrated learning is a strong Contender for experiential learning, as it enables the student to derive meaning and understanding, directly from the learning experience.

Thirdly, this kind of integration not only makes the teaching and learning process joyful, it also has a positive impact on the development of certain life skills, such as communication skills, reflection and enquiry skills, un-conditioning of the mind leading to higher confidence levels and self-esteem, appreciation for a aesthetic and creativity, etc.

Fourthly, this integration broadens the mind of the student and enables her/him to see the multi-disciplinary links between subjects/topics/ real life.

In any arts integration initiative, it is vital students receive explicit instruction in the content and practices of the arts. This way, they learn to make natural connections across content areas in the classroom. Many elementary students are fortunate to have art and music time built into their schedules. However, drama classes are more difficult to find at the elementary level.

Drama is a powerful tool. And in the absence of a drama program in the school, the rest of us should provide students access to the standards, skills, and concepts of this content area for their benefit. Through participation in theatre, students develop speaking and listening skills. Students collaborate with others in accomplishing common goals. Theatre arts promote creativity in problem solving.

Theatre games for kids stretch perspective by giving students opportunities to reflect on behaviors, situations, and personalities in the context of a drama. Drama allows students to demonstrate a deep understanding of pieces of literature. Why wouldn't we want to leverage this amazing tool?

Though many classroom teachers do not have a drama teacher to collaborate with, drama is a natural place to begin arts integration. When teachers effectively integrate the arts in lessons across the curriculum, children learn the fundamentals of math, language arts, and science that will prepare them for success in school, and for a life of engagement in the arts.

BEST EFFECTIVE CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

Classroom management is a term used by teachers to describe the process of ensuring that classroom lessons run smoothly despite disruptive behavior by students. The term also implies the prevention of disruptive behavior. It is possibly the most difficult aspect of teaching for many teachers; indeed experiencing problems in this area causes some to leave teaching. The main reason was “negative students’ attitude”.

Few classroom management techniques are:

Focusing:

The teacher has to be sure to have the attention of everyone in his / her classroom before starting his/her lesson and not to attempt to teach over the chatter of students who are not paying attention.

Direct Instruction:

Direct instruction usually increases the level of excitement in the classroom. The technique of direct instruction is to begin each class by telling the students exactly what will be happening. The teacher outlines what he/she and the student will be doing during the period and he/she may also set time limit for some tasks.

Monitoring:

The key to this technique is to circulate, get up and get around the room. By the time students are working, teacher makes the round and check on their progress.

Modeling:

MC. Daniel tells of a saying that goes: “values are caught, not taught”. Teachers who are courteous, prompt enthusiastic, in control patient and organized provide examples for their students through their own behavior. The “do as I say, not as I do” teachers send mixed messages that confuse students and invite misbehavior. If the teacher wants students to use quiet voices in his/her classroom while the students are working, he/she too has to use a quiet voice as he/she moves through the room helping youngsters.

Non Verbal Cuing:

Nonverbal cues also are facial expressions, body postures and hand signals. Care should be given in choosing the types of cues the teacher use in his/her classroom.

Environmental Control:

A classroom can be warm cheery place students enjoy an environment that changes periodically. Study centers with pictures and color can invite enthusiasm for the teacher’s subject.

Low Profile Intervention:

Teacher’s intervention has to be quiet and calm in order to avoid sending students to the principal’s office. An effective teacher takes care that the student is not rewarded for

misbehavior by becoming the focus of attention he/she monitors the activity in his/her classroom, moving around the room, he/she anticipates problems before they occur.

Positive Discipline:

Teacher must use classroom rules that describe the behaviors he/she wants instead of listing things the student can't do. The teacher has to let his/ her students know that this is how he/she expects them to behave in his/her classroom.

The entire above are considered effective techniques a good teacher may use for her classroom management. But a good teacher is the one who knows which one to use at the exact time and how he/she should balance between them, so that he/she will have a model classroom environment.

A good teacher is the one who knows his/her students, how would they be motivated to learn, how would they react with him/her inside the classroom. Everything a teacher does in the class help him/her in classroom management, how well the teacher is prepared, how he/she is managing his/her time, how much the activities are appropriate for the students' level, how much the objectives are clear for the students, and how much the students are ready and motivated to learn. All these conditions are effective for managing the classroom.

Teacher can also use his/her voice tune as a tool to get the learner's attention, not only this, but also switching the light off in a sudden may also help the teacher to get the students' attention.

Students are smart enough to know when to be noisy and when to disturb the teacher, but the teacher has to be smarter to know how to get the students involved in the lesson. And I do agree that once the student is motivated to learn and knows why he is there, he won't misbehave and a calm quiet environment for teaching and learning will exist.

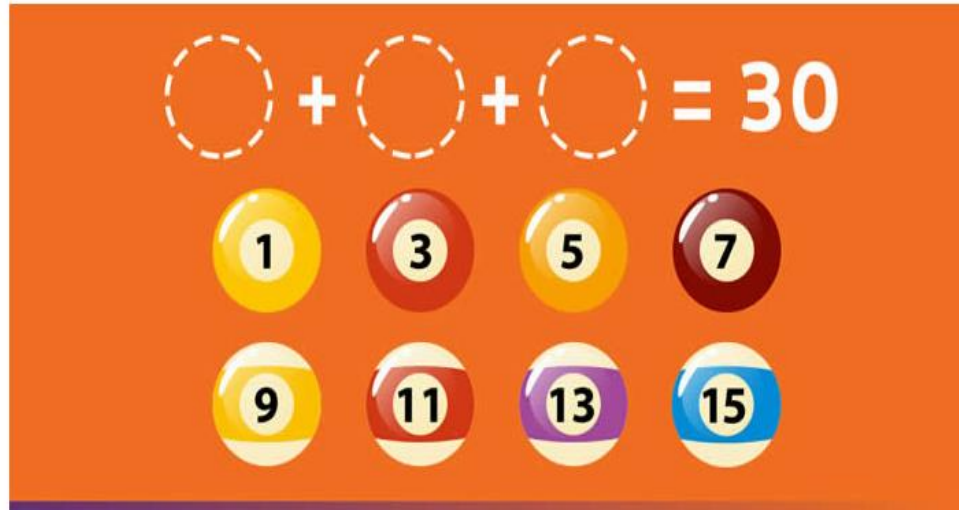
