Most of this is learned unconsciously – children and teenagers absorb their parent's attitudes and expectations of them as they grow up," says Keller.

ANNUAL REPORT 2017-18

'We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence is therefore not an act but a habit'. – Aristotle.

The college went in for the second cycle of reaccreditation by the National Accreditation and Assessment Council of India in August last year. The members of the peer team, after a thorough inspection of all the facilities and activities of the college awarded the college with B++ Grade with a score of 2.8.

The academic sessions for the M.Ed. and B.Ed. courses, 2017-19 batch commenced with all vibrancy in October 2017, with **100** students in the B.Ed. course and **46** students in the M.Ed. course. The instructional framework was remodeled this year. Inputs were drawn from the theory of andragogy, as well as from constructivist and cognitive approaches. This model was designed to provide an active, engaging learning environment that allows for practical application of knowledge and skills. Curriculum was designed to be outcome-focused, centering on real-world and relevant learning activities to prepare students to meet their professional life goals.

Library facilities: The College library has a collection of about 10,357 books. It subscribes to 11 Magazines, 24 Journals and 7 newspapers. The total number of books added during the current year was 83. The Library was renovated and automated in the year 2017. The computer and internet facilities are available to the teachers, students and the library staff. CCTV cameras are installed in the library. The students are encouraged to use the library extensively for reference work in their theory subjects, research work, assignments, etc.

ICT laboratory facilities: 20 computers with latest configuration are present in the laboratory; they are interconnected and have internet facility. Wi-Fi access points are being planned for the students. Login IDs have been issued to all the faculty members.

Internship Programme: The B.Ed. students are sent to different schools of twin cities for their Internship for a period of 4 months spread over 3 semesters.

According to the rules of the State Government, most of the students were sent to the Government schools for their Internship. The students participated whole heartedly in all the activities of the school. They organized PTA meetings, Science exhibitions and conducted action research.

Project work: The students did the project work either individually or in a group. Different topics were assigned to different students to avoid repetition and copying. Practical classes were conducted for the B.Ed students in the **Language Laboratory**. Students were given practice in creative writing, phonetics, expository writing, etc.

Use of ICT: Digital e-portfolios were prepared by the students of B.Ed. course. Excerpts of all the activities taken up by them, in 2 years, are show cased in the eportfolio. Several multimedia presentations were also prepared with the help of PowerPoint in different subjects like Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, English Language, Social Studies and Biological Sciences. The students also prepared digital lesson plans, blogs, brochures and newsletters.

The M.Ed students took up classes for the B.Ed students integrating technology (PowerPoint presentations) in their teaching.

Two LCD projectors were installed in the class rooms.

Research work: The students of M.Ed. course take up in-depth research work every year and submit a monograph report.

Mentorship: An effective strategy used to train student teachers is by assigning a formal mentor, to work one-on-one with them. The lecturers of the college are entrusted the responsibility of mentorship. They monitor the progress of the students regularly and help in resolving their problems, if any.

Literary activities like elocution, debate, extempore talk and recitation competitions were organized.

Cultural Fest: A Cultural festival, **'Experia 2017'** was organized in the college from 19th to 21st November, 2017. It was inaugurated by Ms.Sharmila Agarwal, renowned Ikebana expert. The B.Ed. students prepared several art and

craft items, food items, etc. They enacted role play and drama during the 3-day celebrations.

Games and Sports: Several games and sports were organized for the college students.

Celebration of Important Days: National Festivals like Independence Day and Republic Day were celebrated. Teacher's day was also celebrated.

Extension lectures/seminars/workshops organized:

The following seminars and extension lectures were organized in the college to enable the students and teachers to keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in the field of education.

- 1. A 'one-day Seminar on "Exploring Neuroscience and its influence on the teaching learning process" was organized on 11th October, 2017. The key note address was delivered by Ms. Anjum Babukhan, Director, Glendale Academy. Several eminent educationists presented papers at the Seminar. Teacher educators, Principals and teachers from different schools of twin cities attended the program.
- 2. A demonstration cum lecture by Ms.Sharmila Agarwal on Ikebana style of flower arrangement was organized on 19th November, 2017.
- 3. An extension lecture by Dr. Syed Najmuddin on the topic, 'Importance of Health in our day to day life' was organized on 13th April, 2017.
- 4. An Extension lecture by Ms. Anjali Jain, Founder Director, and Centre for Teacher Accreditation on **'Teacher Empowerment'** was organized in January, 2018.
- 5. A Work shop on "Demonstration of Art & Craft items and preparation of Teaching Aids" was conducted for students of the B.Ed., course in December, 2017.
- 6. A work shop on **'Yoga and its benefits'** were organized for college students in December last year.

The Students Council: The student's council is a body of elected members that

incorporates a sense of leadership and democracy among the students. An election for Class representatives was held for both the sections of the B.Ed. course.

Internal examinations were conducted regularly for the students of B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses.

<u>Results</u>: The overall performance of the college students was good. In the academic year 2017-19, the pass percentage in the **M.Ed**. course was 93% with 1 student getting O grade(distinction), 32 students getting A grade (I Division), 05 students getting B grade (I division). 3 students failed. The pass percentage in the **B.Ed**. course was 97% with 30 distinctions, 56 first divisions and 3 second divisions. 3 students failed.

A FEW OTHER HAPPENINGS...

- Annual Day of the college was celebrated in April last year. Mrs. Anita Rajendra, Principal Secretary, Department of Home, Government of Telangana was invited as the chief guest.
- A picnic to Wonderla was organized for the college students in November last year.
- Students participated whole heartedly in the Haritha Haram program in July last year.

Programmes for in-service teachers:

The college caters to the needs of not only pre service teachers but also in-service teachers.

The members of the Academic Committee visited the Sultan-Ul-Uloom group of schools in February, 2017 to talk to the teachers and students of Classes IX and X.

Several meetings of the Principals of the old city schools with members of the Academic Committee were convened last year to discuss the progress and academic activities of the schools.

Community Service was taken up by the M.Ed and B.Ed., students. They adopted several slum areas around Hyderabad City and organized programmes for the welfare of community people.

Faculty accomplishments:

The faculty members of the college are constantly upgrading their qualifications and in the process winning laurels for themselves and the college.

- Several Articles were published by lecturers of the college in educational journals at State and national level.
- Books and Teaching material were authored by lecturers in English and Telugu languages.
- Almost all the staff members acted as resource persons and presented papers at various workshops and Seminars at National and State level, conducted by the Osmania University and its constituent institutions.
- The Principal and lecturers attended orientation programmes, seminars and workshops in Education.

Inspections held: A team from the Osmania University came for Annual inspection in July last year.

Drama as a Teaching Tool

Drama is a performing art, an outlet for self-expression, and a way of learning. Drama is an effective learning tool because it involves the student intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally. Activities in improvisation, pantomime, play-making, and scene reenactment serve to develop the creative potential in the participants and help to develop critical thinking skills.

In answering the question, "why teach drama?", theater director and teaching artist Matt Buchanan has this to say: "Dramatic Arts education is an important means of stimulating creativity in problem solving. It can challenge students' perceptions about their world and about themselves. Dramatic exploration can provide students with an outlet for emotions, thoughts, and dreams that they might not otherwise have means to express. A student can, if only for a few

moments, become another, explore a new role, try out and experiment with various personal choices and solutions to very real problems-problems from their own life, or problems faced by characters in literature or historical figures. This can happen in a safe atmosphere, where actions and consequences can be examined, discussed, and in a very real sense experienced without the dangers and pitfalls that such experimentation would obviously lead to in the "real" world. This is perhaps the most important reason for Dramatic Arts in schools."

The benefits of using creative play as a teaching methodology coincide with the established goals of education. These include:

- developing the imagination and creativity
- fostering critical thinking and problem-solving skills
- exploring and evaluating ideas
- discovering positive ways of dealing with conflict
- expressing feelings and interpreting the feelings of others
- enhancing communication skills
- ➤ improving literacy skills

Participation in drama activities provides the teacher with another way to assess the student. Through dramatic play, students reveal how they organize ideas, solve work problems, with conflict, and in deal use their a group, imagination. Observing how students dramatize an event offers valuable insight into how they perceive, interpret, understand, and analyze the material at the core of the lesson.

Drama has many practical classroom applications for teaching curricular material. Important concepts, ideas, events, and people can be dramatized through improvisation, pantomime, and playwriting to stimulate interest, convey knowledge, gain comprehension, and improve retention.

Drama can be the vehicle for the following applications:

- Role plays situations to model/observe new skills or behaviors.
- Develop scenarios to introduce new concepts.
- Dramatize a meeting between characters or historical figures.
- \succ Reenact a real event.
- Dramatize a scene that might have happened in a story.
- Improvise a scene that expresses the topic or theme.
- > Act out scenarios as a way to approach writing dialogue.
- > Create literary sketches.
- > Stimulate ideas for composing essays, poetry, or fiction.
- Portray famous people.

Drama is a teaching tool that allows students to participate, demonstrate, and observe in a "controlled," or non-threatening, environment. In other words, it provides another "non-traditional" opportunity for students to learn and to demonstrate learning. At the same time, drama helps students get in touch with their creativity and spontaneity as well as to develop confidence in the expression of their ideas. Finally, it teaches self-discipline, acceptance of and positive response to criticism, and cooperation with others.
